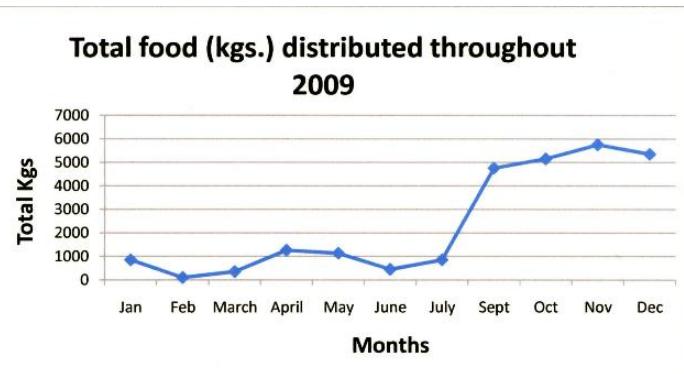

Excerpt from Second Bite's Annual report

In late 2008, SecondBite commenced operations in Tasmania in response to requests from welfare agencies for its services, as there was no other comparable organisation supporting food relief agencies in the region. SecondBite was involved in successfully lobbying the Tasmanian Government to introduce the Civil Liability Amendment Bill (Good Samaritan Act) and, following the successful progression of the bill were allowed to commence food rescue operations in the state.

In March 2009 a Food Program Manager, Pat Burton, was appointed and a refrigerated truck was purchased. An operational base has been donated for the next 12 months by a recipient agency that we serve in Hobart.

Currently, with the assistance of volunteers, SecondBite, visits supermarkets to collect fresh produce approaching its sell-by date. This food is then delivered to 39 recipient agencies with a regular supply of fresh fruit, vegetables, dairy, meat and other foods. The volume of food delivered is now consistently in excess of 5 tonnes per month, which equates to more than 10,000 hearty, nutritious meals!



I have received a lot of vegetables and fruit from SecondBite and I have encouraged our Youth Group to eat it. One of them ate a carrot for the first time and went home and asked his mother for some more carrots. She was happily surprised. He continues to come back to our Centre to try more fruit and vegetables.
